Christmas Superdraw to raise money for local hospices

Local not-for-profit organisation The Hospice Lottery Partnership has launched its annual Christmas Superdraw to raise much needed funds to help support patients and families that are cared for by local hospices including:

Every ticket sold helps to make a difference to those in need of hospice care. For example, £5 could help pay for a patient's meals for one day; £15 could help pay for materials for a therapy session at a day hospice; £20 could help pay for an hour of nursing care; £50 could help pay for a first assessment visit to a patient at home.

There are some great cash prizes to be won including a top prize of £2,500, second prize of £500, third prize of £200 and two fourth prizes of £100.

A previous Superdraw winner said: "I support The Hospice Lottery to help raise funds for the wonderful work that my local hospices do. I never expected to win anything, let alone the top prize. It is truly wonderful and being presented with my cheque was such a treat. I am now looking forward to sharing my good fortune with the rest of my family".
